REGULATING MONOPOLIES

REGULATING MONOPOLIES

- Monopoly utilities don't have any competition they are the only company allowed to sell you power in a geographic area.
- Because utilities have no competitors, their prices are regulated. To change their prices, a utility must first receive approval.
- The Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission (IURC) is the state agency that oversees monopoly utilities.

INDIANA LAWS UNDERMINING EFFECTIVE REGULATION (1/2)

- Blank Check for Grid Spending: SEA 560 (2013) and HEA 1470 (2019) allowed utilities to recover *billions* in grid spending through the Transmission, Distribution, and Storage System Improvement Charges (TDSIC) bill tracker.
- Blank Check for Power Plants: SEA 29 (2002), SEA 271 (2022), and HEA 1421 (2023) allow utilities to charge ratepayers for power plants while they are under construction, before they are producing any electricity, and even if they NEVER produce any electricity.
- Reduced IURC Authority: SEA 251 (2011) and SEA 9 (2023) shifted all costs of complying directly or indirectly with any federal mandate onto consumers.




INDIANA LAWS UNDERMINING EFFECTIVE REGULATION (2/2)

- Energy Efficiency Program Replaced: SEA 340 (2014) and SEA 412 (2015) repealed Indiana's energy efficiency program and replaced it with a far worse policy.
- Gutted Rooftop Solar: SEA 309 (2017) phased out solar net metering, making rooftop solar much less affordable for households.





RATE CASE OVERVIEW


 CenterPoint filed a rate case in December 2023 in requesting that the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission (IURC) increase its electric rates.

CenterPoint is requesting:


- A \$118.8 million (16.02%) increase in its annual revenue requirement
- A residential bill increase of \$47.24 per month (30.7%) for 799 kWh of usage, compared to December 2023 rates.
- An average transitional (electric heating) residential customer bill increase of \$63.33 per month for 1,129 kWh of usage.
- New rates would be phased in over 3 step increases by 2026




AFFORDABILITY CRISIS FOR CENTERPOINT CUSTOMERS




 Highest residential fixed charge of any investor-owned electric utility in Indiana and one of the highest of any investor-owned electric utility in the U.S.




- Highest residential variable charges of any investor-owned electric utility in Indiana.
 - Total rate would increase from 17.1 cents/kWh to 22.3 cents/kWh by 2026, a 30% increase




 Highest regulator-authorized profit margin ("return on equity" or "ROE") of any investor-owned utility in Indiana and of any CenterPoint subsidiary utility



 Massive compensation packages for executives: More than \$88 million paid to the CEO of CenterPoint Energy, Inc. between 2017-2022. The CEO's total compensation in 2022 was \$13.8 million.



• **CEI South Electric is already making tens of millions in profit each year:** Much of this net income (profitability) is sent to its parent company, most of which leaves Indiana. CenterPoint is proposing to increase its profit.



ISSUES IMPACTING BILLS

Large investments in coal plants

- \$506 million in pollution control equipment since 2007
- \$341 million in costs securitized for retired A.B. Brown Units 1 & 2
- \$63 million in coal ash clean up 2023-2025
- Two new A.B. Brown natural gas power plant units and pipeline that will operate very infrequently, yet will cost residential customers about \$18/month.
 - \$334 million capital cost, plus \$546 million to use the new pipeline for 20 years, plus fuel costs.
- Posey Solar
 - \$429 million investment in a 191 MW solar facility, plus additional solar power contracts, starting in 2024-2026



ISSUES IMPACTING BILLS

Large spending on transmission and distribution grid

- \$454 million for 2024-2028 TDSIC Plan
- \$447 million for 2017-2023 TDSIC Plan
- Sweetheart deals and favorable cost allocation for big industrial customers
 - CenterPoint's 4CP cost allocation proposal would force residential customers to subsidize industrial customers' electric bills.
- \$2.1 million cost of CenterPoint's lawyers and experts in this rate case
- Small number of CenterPoint customers

PUBLIC HEARINGS – WHAT TO SAY

- This is your opportunity to tell the Commission what you think about CenterPoint's rate increase proposal
 - Share your story. It is important for Commissioners to hear how this rate increase impacts CenterPoint customers like you.
 - You can read written comments aloud. Consider writing down your comments in advance and reading them aloud so you don't forget anything important.
 - Be polite, concise, and stick to your key points. We want to convince regulators to our point of view – not make them defensive.




PUBLIC HEARINGS – WHAT TO EXPECT

Be prepared for the process:

- Arrive early and fill out an informational sheet that tells them you want to speak.
- The judge will ask everyone who plans to speak to stand and give an oath.
- When it is your turn to speak, your name will be called and you will go up to the lectern.
- You will first be asked by the OUCC lawyer or the judge to spell your name.
- Then, it is your turn to speak into a microphone and give your comments, which will be transcribed by a court reporter.
- Your comments will provide evidence that the Commission will weigh in reaching a decision in this case. THANK YOU!
- Note: CAC will attend, but not speak at, the public hearings because this is an opportunity for CenterPoint ratepayers to give comments. CAC will be filing written expert testimony and legal briefs as a formal intervenor in the case.
